Public Comment from:

- <u>Rose Kleiner</u> expressed frustration that we are being asked again to do more with less for the educators but not for the other sides of Five Keys, there are waitlists including interest enough to add 3 more teachers at Santa Rita Jail, do not have org chart and get emails that people are mysteriously being hired on the management side
- <u>Matt Milton</u>- regarding retention and bad processes, need to stop splitting teachers at sites and get ESL classes in Canvas
- <u>Austen Coles</u> glad that you are in agreement that the SpEd department is a vital resource; hoping the increased Special Education budget will allow the school to hire staff member to work in NorCal and SpEd-based staff to offer mental health resources. Also hopes that SpEd staff will start being paid equitably for holding extra students on their roster, as Sped staff are paid half as much as other credentialed teachers.
- <u>Emily Gable</u>- echoing the frustration of being moved between sites, as movement affects student engagement and ADA; also wants to echo the frustration of not having an org chart does not know who the people are who have been hired, seems like this is an area that we should be addressing in terms of the budget.
 - <u>Response from Steve Good</u> the individuals being hired have been largely non-profit employees
- <u>Nan Foster</u>- has brought this up several times prior, noting that there are no classes on Canvas for students who are below a 4th grade reading score in CASAS; students cannot access the online curriculum, impacting engagement
- <u>Ms. Tierra</u> every year we speak to financial deficits but we never say why; it seems that Five Keys does not have a money problem, it has a management problem, management decided not to bring back all the teachers laid off despite there being wait lists
- <u>Ms. LaQuette</u> there are three letters that keep on coming up ADA. We just had an opportunity to discuss ideas at an all-school PD, no one is knocking on her door to ask her why and how her ADA is so high.
- <u>Judy Square</u> there is a new requirement that we cannot backdate enrollments, even if we saw the student the week prior – probably could get 3-7 days more attendance if she were allowed to have the schedule reflect the original date of engagement. Why can't we do this.
- <u>Karla Munoz</u> Administrative Assistant at Boyle Heights in SoCal there has been no consistency; have had over 11 principals, has been able to keep student retained since January because of the consistency, and that retention is about relationships
